The Jesuits: Slices of History

St Ignatius Loyola, whose feast day is July 31, founded the Society of Jesus in Paris in 1534. He intended it to embody a quasi-military level of commitment to evangelization. The name "Jesuits" was used derogatorily by the Order's adversaries, but it eventually stuck and was proudly adopted by the members. They soon came to specialize in teaching and evangelization among the peoples, including the elites, of far-flung non-western cultures. In these missionary contexts, they balanced orthodoxy, firm obedience to the papacy, and strategic flexibility to experiment with early forms of acculturation (removing barriers to evangelization by adopting local languages and acceptable non-European cultural practices into the lifestyle and liturgy).

The Jesuits first arrived in Acadia in 1611, and after eviction by the English, moved to Québec in 1625. In New France, they learned Aboriginal languages and customs, developed dictionaries and grammars, translated and preserved much of the history and traditions in their documents. The most famous of these documents are *The Jesuit Relations*, which include details of their activities and missions to Indigenous peoples – both the failures and the successes.

In 1764, when the Jesuits were suppressed in France and colonies by order of Louis XV, the Bishop in Québec refused to implement the edict. However, in 1773, Pope Clement XIV dissolved the Order worldwide – for political, not theological reasons. The 1770s in Québec were the period of transition to British rule, and the new Crown laid claim to Jesuit properties and forbade new Jesuit recruits from entering. Already in a holding pattern, the Order gradually declined until the last Jesuit in Québec died in 1800. After Pope Pius VII rescinded their suppression in 1814, the Order began returning to Québec and the rest of Canada. This allowed the Jesuits to proceed with the foundation of parishes, schools and post-secondary institutions throughout Canada. The Collège des Jésuites evolved into Université Laval, and Loyola College in Montréal, founded in 1848 as an Englishlanguage program of the Society became a distinct institution in 1896.

Today, the Jesuit Society is the largest men's religious order in the Catholic Church. In 2011 there were approximately 20,000 Jesuits worldwide, with about 500 Canadian members divided equally between English and French in two juridical regions. Canadian Jesuits support the evangelical work of missions around the world.
