TRANSFIGURATION: A Summer Meditation

The feast of the Transfiguration every August 6th receives special attention this year because it falls on a Sunday. The mountain-top location of the Transfiguration signals its importance, and also its "apartness" from everyday life. On our own "mountain" during the traditional summer vacation, we can rethink priorities, set goals, and evaluate our relationship with God and with others.... But mountaintop experiences are not perpetual. They are pauses that renew and refresh us. Then, when we are called to descend from the mountain and face anew the exigencies of life, we will find ourselves better equipped to do so.

Today's first reading from the Book of Daniel foreshadows precisely today's Gospel reading: "One like a son of man coming with the clouds of heaven.... To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him." Strengthening the connection between Jesus and the Old Testament, Moses and Elijah appear with Him to represent the law and the prophets, respectively. But soon, looking around, Peter, James, and John "no longer saw anyone but Jesus." Thus it is made clear that the law and the prophets are fulfilled in Jesus; to further affirm his unique and salvific role, the voice from the cloud echoes the words that resounded during Jesus' baptism, saying, "Listen to him."

Jesus is quick to ask his disciples to make the Transfiguration public only after He has risen from the dead. Until then, Jesus would dedicate himself to transforming others. As he changed sinners into forgiven believers, the alienated into friends, the sick and the maimed into healthy people, He also widened provincial and nationalistic concerns into universal care. We who are his followers are to continue the process of transformation until He comes in glory. In this way, the Transfiguration associates Jesus with the transfiguration of the world catalyzed by the nascent Kingdom of God as described in the New Testament.
