times. It was the site of five ecumenical councils; the Papal residence adjoined the basilica until the 14th Century. The inscription over the doorway reads in Latin: "Mother and head of all the churches of the city [of Rome] and of the world." That is why the dedication of the Lateran Basilica is celebrated in parish churches [all over the world].

Through Rome we connect to all Catholics everywhere. We are one people despite our native language, our race or ethnicity, our station in life. That is what this day is about: building the whole people of God, across space and time, into a holy temple. As the building is sacred so are we each created to be holy temples of the Spirit of God. Shouldn't we be careful about allowing ourselves to be treated as mere consumers or commodities? We are more than our possessions or our market value. Maybe it's time to clean house for the Divine Guest. Jesus' bold actions in purifying and cleansing the [Jerusalem] temple made it clear from the outset that his ministry would replace the former dispensation with the new and living temple of his very self.
