Discovering Christ, Finding Our Calling

Isaiah's universal visions were representative of a prophetic spirit that emerged after the [Babylonian] exile. He was convinced that the restoration of Judah and its renewed dignity as God's chosen people would have repercussions on the rest of humankind, and he infused his visions with a messianic and eschatological character. Because of the salvific power of the Lord, Judah would witness to the nations of the power and glory of God. Only later would [this] vision be fulfilled: when Jesus appears, the ultimate

epiphany (or manifestation) of God's glory, the dark clouds of sin and death will have been banished.

We can see that the magi offer eloquent testimony of the universal parameters of God's salvific concerns. From them, we learn that it takes daring and courage to set out on life's journey. Their

itinerary was planned by a star. In a world where travel was not convenient and could be quite dangerous, they allowed themselves to be led. Moreover, they were not afraid of Herod and were not fooled by his plotting. They followed the signal of a rising star, and they were open to accepting revelation that came in the form of a dream....

An ancient legend [has it that] the magi were of three different ages and entered the home of Joseph in Bethlehem one at a time.... When the senior citizen Melchior entered, he met an old man near his age, and they spoke together of memory and gratitude. Middle-aged Balthazar encountered a middle-aged teacher and they spoke passionately of leadership and responsibility. When the young Caspar entered, he met a young prophet, and they talked of reform and promise. After that, the three of them [brought their gifts into a room where] they met an infant with his mother. Later, [perhaps on the return trip to the east,] they began to understand: Jesus, the Saviour, speaks to each of us at every stage of life. The elderly hear the call to integrity and wisdom. The middle-aged hear the call to generosity and responsibility. The young hear the call to authenticity and intimacy.

Today, the call of the Saviour is extended to each of us. What do you hear? How will you respond? With what gifts will you welcome him? Will you be humble enough to believe in visions and prophecies, and daring enough to work toward their fulfillment? Will you believe? With God's grace, we can do all these things.


