Changing Value Systems: A New Way of Looking at Reality

[For the fishers called in today's Gospel reading,] there's no plan of action except to follow Jesus.... The outward sign that they've repented, or totally changed their value systems, is when they put

people instead of fish at the centre of their lives.... Not only do they have no idea where [Jesus is] taking them, they're committing themselves to a lifetime of discovering who this



Galilean carpenter actually is. ...Like Jonah, who [in today's OT reading] was forced to deal with the mercy dimension of Yahweh's personality, [the new disciples would] eventually have to throw all their preconceived notions [overboard]. He wouldn't turn out to be the [kind of] messiah the vast majority of Jews were expecting; he would not throw the Romans out of Palestine, nor set up a Jewish kingdom. In the end, these four fishers would find out they had abandoned their nets... [for] someone who, at this point, they hardly knew. As time went by, they uncovered more and more implications of the "Yes" they gave to that almost random call.... [And by the time 1 Corinthians was written, this] movement that had begun 30 years before in an out-of-the-way Roman province was over-turning the value system of the world's most powerful empire.... [Jesus'] followers had ushered in a new way of looking at reality.

If some aspects of our Christian morality [seem to] have changed through the centuries, it's not because we're trying to be socially acceptable or politically correct, but because we've discovered new ways in which the risen Jesus is relating to us and those around us. Christian slave owners, for instance, traditionally defended their ownership of other human beings.... From our perspective, we'd... accuse them of conveniently overlooking the freeing dimensions of Jesus' personality, something a lot of his followers haven't noticed until recently....
