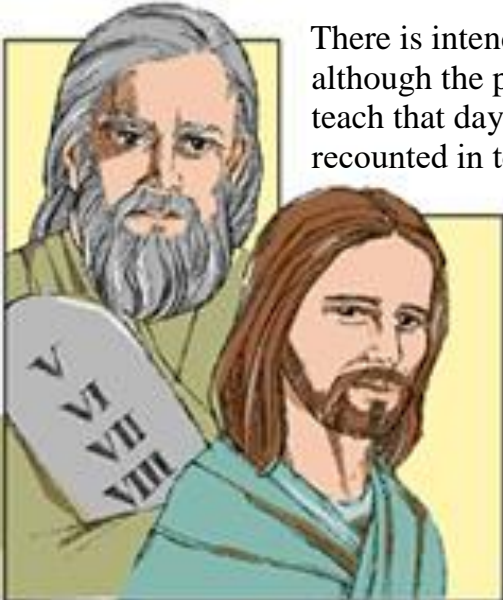

“The Holy One of God”

As Jesus grew into a deeper understanding of his role, it is clear that he regarded himself as the proclaimer of the Kingdom and a prophet like Moses who would speak the words God gave him to speak... in terms of the promise made in this [first reading from Deuteronomy]... He also accepted his role as a Moses-like mediator who would offer a new law of love, and he would live according to that law to his death....



There is intended irony in the fact that although the people who heard Jesus teach that day in Capernaum [as recounted in today's Gospel reading]

were amazed at his authority, it was the unclean spirit who identified him as “the Holy One of God.” This title also reflects the faith of Mark and his community, who had accepted Jesus as the long-awaited Saviour and the

“prophet like Moses” who had come to inaugurate the reign of God on earth....

For all who will listen and learn, Jesus continues to be God's prophet, speaking God's words and bringing to light God's will and God's ways. We are called to take his words to heart and live accordingly. To that end, the psalmist for today implores us, “O that today you would hear his voice and harden not your hearts” (Psalm 95).

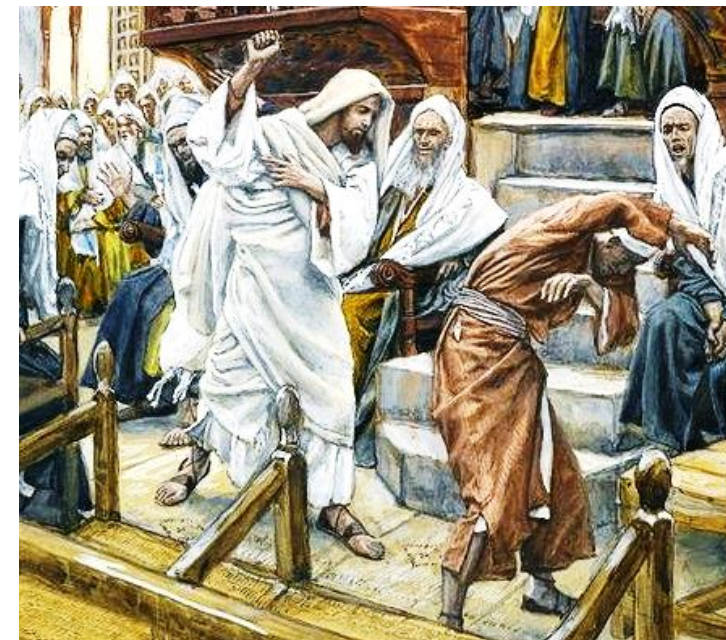
