Power, Mercy, and Community

We shouldn't miss the fact [in today's first reading] that Peter, in referring to his healing of the lame man, speaks of "salvation," a term that can connote a spiritual and social, as well as physical reality.... Peter has learned from the Master, not just

about preaching and doing the work of the kingdom, but also about how to unmask hypocritical leaders.... We can begin to understand why the religious authorities [of the day] were so upset. There was a power afoot that was utterly independent of them. It had not stopped with Jesus' execution, and now they were doing what they could to oppose it, but to little avail. Allowing Peter and his companions to continue what they were doing in that name was tantamount to surrendering their power and authority and admitting their mistake in rejecting Jesus.

In the Gospel today, Jesus uses the treasured metaphor of the shepherd to describe his relationship with us... an intimacy that goes beyond even what John talked about in the second reading.... He promises that we can know him as he knows us, as he and the Father know one another.... We celebrate Easter by praying to be part of the community of the risen Christ. But it is less a comfort zone than a staging area for God's mission of mercy to the world. Are we ready and willing to be good shepherds ourselves?
