The Meaning of Trinity

The word "Trinity," referring to three distinct "persons" in one Godhead, is not explicitly spelled out in the New Testament, though there are references there that can be used as a basis for the concept... Some confusion is caused by the word "person," which assuredly was not meant to imply the legal concept of a natural human organism as we now understand the word. The Latin word *persona* probably comes from the theatre, where it meant a mask, a character, or a role. Even within one performance, the same actor could play several different roles, each with its own character attributes. Peeling back the onion, this word *persona* could have originated with the Latin verb *per-sonare*, literally *to sound through*, which would be appropriate for a character speaking through a theatrical mask.

How do we answer the question: "Who is your Lord?"

Just prior to today's [Gospel] reading is the story of the guards who ran off to tell the chief priests what had happened at the tomb of Jesus. It contains a brief description of two communities, each with its own ways of being in relationship.

The guards report to the priests and elders, who hold the governor to be the highest authority in the land. They instruct the guards to spread the lie that Jesus' body was stolen from the tomb by his followers, and give the guards money to encourage their obedience in the deceit. [In contrast,] Jesus and the Eleven have a different focus and a different purpose.

One way of being in relationship [– the way of the Romans and their guards –] takes power by any means possible; gives priority to empire over all else; and denies God in deed regardless of the sound bites it professes in word.... The other way [– that of Jesus and the Eleven –] gives away power whenever there is a chance; holds out for more equitable relationships; and takes seriously the presence of God in the here and now, not just in the hereafter.

The two scenes leave us with a choice. To which of these two communities do we wish to belong? Do we stand with the guards gathered with the priests and elders in Jerusalem, or with the Eleven gathered with Jesus in Galilee? This, too, is the great challenge at the ending of Matthew. We are asked, "Who is your Lord?" And our answer will determine the kind of disciples we become.
