We are participants in Christ, Paul says in 1 Corinthians. We have merged; we ourselves have been

transubstantiated. And part of the process is that eating from the one loaf makes us one body. We don't have to be selfsufficient anymore. Unlike the people who see themselves, first and foremost, as selfsufficient individuals, we

who share this bread see ourselves, first and foremost, as a community caring for one another. It is precisely that connectedness that allows the human self to be as sufficient as possible. Outside of that connectedness, the drive toward self-sufficiency is merely a form of brokenness. It denies community and in so doing destroys part of what makes us human... Our society... is much more oriented toward commodities than community. Our consumer market economy values people as commodities ...

In this context, to recall and celebrate the feast of the body and blood of Christ is to recall and celebrate God's presence as bread for the community, and the transubstantiation of community into the very body and blood of Christ. Selfsufficiency cannot achieve this... We are not the yeast, or the flour, or the fire. But together we rise.


