The Tree: Symbol of a Great Kingdom

It is God who gives the growth and ensures the harvest.... Through [the parables in today's Gospel of Mark...] Jesus hoped to provoke thought and challenge his listeners to take moral and decisive action.

Given adequate care and climate, the mustard shrub could grow as tall as eight to ten feet and was full enough for birds to rest in its branches. In Jewish prophetic and apocalyptic literature, the sheltering tree was a symbol of a great empire or kingdom offering protection and security to all peoples (Ezekiel 17:13; 21:1-9; 31:6; Dan 4:10-12). The Marcan community of the 60s was undergoing a persecution that threatened their survival, and so the imagery of the seed growing slowly but surely must have offered them great encouragement. More challenging, perhaps, was the community's growing awareness that Jesus' mission was universal and that the mighty shrub of the kingdom had nesting places for *all*, gentiles as well as Jews. Today, we continue to be challenged by the all-inclusive love that God lavishes on – and expects from – every believer. – *Celebration (excerpted/paraphrased)*
