#### Jesus and the Boys

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." (Mark 9: 33-35)

Like seven-year-olds wearing black capes and flying through the green back yard

we spit and sputter in staccato speech, I'm the greatest... no I am... no really it's me

all while listening to our Jesus buddy ramble on about betrayal and death and a whisper about after that

but we raise our pecan stick swords way high over head and battle and pretend a beheaded victory

still the Nazareth dude nullifies our superhero powers reminding us of the one thing that deflates grandiosity:

someone has come to serve you and lift you up even you who imagine you alone lift yourself up

and so we crack the sticks on our knees, untie our capes and pray: help us redefine greatness through you
