# **IMPORTANT NOTICE: Covid Restrictions**

Strict physical attendance limits have been re-imposed for indoor religious services. Under the restrictions in effect until at least February 1<sup>st</sup>, the maximum number allowed to attend is 25 if no vaccination requirement is in place. # REFLECTION

# WHAT THE WEDDING AT CANA MEANS FOR US

Cana was in Galilee, a poor province next to Jerusalem, its people ignored and forgotten by the rest of the world. In the subsistence economy of First-Century Palestine, it was probably a source of shame for the hosts – but nevertheless a common experience – for poor people to run out of wine before the traditional seven days of a wedding celebration were over.

But we shouldn't get too caught up with the details of the wedding or the wine. For us in the 21st Century, running out of food or drink at such an important celebration would be a rare faux pas. We'd have to fire the wedding planner. But we *do* know what it's like to run out. To run out of time, options, opportunity, energy, or even money at the end of a paycheque. For example, we might run out of time to spend with our spouses or kids at the end of a long work day, or time to spend with grandkids at the end of a short once-a-year visit. We might run out of treatment options at the end of a battle with disease or illness. We might run out of chances to fix a broken marriage or relationship or friendship. We might run out of time to get our affairs in order or make our own decisions before a health crisis hits. Like those wedding guests in Cana, we know very well in our world what it's like to run out, not to have enough, to be bound by limits and walls, for death always to be waiting for us. We live the world of Cana every day. That wedding wasn't unusual because wine ran out...

Not at all unusual... except for Mary, because she knows something no one else knows. She pleads with Jesus as someone she knows can change things. That endings and limits and running out and death don't have to be the way of the world. So when the wine runs out, from her lived experience, she seems to be looking to Jesus for a different world. She is pleading for a glimpse of the new creation of Messiah.

So Jesus tells the servants to fills the water jars.... And the water becomes wine. It's a wonderful gift that Jesus bestows on this wedding, but the wine is only one part of the gift that is given. No one else seems to realize what has happened for this small and poor wedding in the middle of nowhere is that *God has stepped in.* God changed the ending we're used to, the running out, the limits and walls, even the end that is death. For Jesus has symbolically brought the wedding back to life, has changed the normal order of the world. The order where death always wins....

And as the wedding at Cana is transformed, so are we. As endings and limits and walls and deaths punctuate our lives, Jesus transforms us. Not with quick fixes for our shortcomings and problems. Rather, just as he changes our lack into an abundance of bread and wine, he turns our brokenness and sin into forgiveness and mercy; he turns death into new life. Jesus gives us the first miracle, which foreshadows the last: the miracle of the empty tomb.
