REFLECTION

The traditions of Laetare Sunday... by any other name

Today's Gospel story of the return of the prodigal son gives us images of penitence (on the part of the son) and of divine mercy (on the part of the father). It is also presented as an occasion of joy, as the father tells the obedient elder son, "we had to celebrate and rejoice..." [emphasis added].

Throughout the Western Catholic Church (and among many Lutherans and Anglicans), the Fourth Sunday in Lent, at the mid-point of the penitential season – exactly 21 days before Easter – is called **Laetare Sunday**, (*mi-carême* in French). It is intended to relax briefly the austerity of Lent and encourage the faithful to persevere in their sacrifices, fasting, alms-giving, and good works. This Sunday gets its name from the first few words of the traditional Latin entrance antiphon for the Mass of the day from Isaiah 66: 10: "Laetare Jerusalem...". The words are: "Rejoice, O Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast."

To express the joy of this occasion, the Pope used to carry a rose at Mass, and sometimes send golden roses to Catholic rulers and various distant churches and dioceses. This Sunday and the mid-point of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) are the only two in the liturgical year when the priest has the option of wearing a rose-coloured chasuble. For these reasons, it is also sometimes called **Rose Sunday**.

A few more subtle liturgical options are available to convey our joy that Easter is just around the corner. Despite the Ordo's general ban on flowers at the altar throughout Lent, an exception is made today. Similarly, this is also the only day during Lent when use of the organ is approved at Mass and for Vespers. While marriages traditionally were not celebrated during the penitential season (a restriction more recently narrowed to Good Friday and Holy Saturday), they have always been allowed on this day.

Laetare Sunday is also known in some parts, especially in Britain and Ireland, as **Mothering Sunday**. People used to return with gifts on this day to the church where they were baptized. St Ignatius Parish cordially welcomes anyone who returns here to us to carry out this pious custom, in the hope that your visit will bring you lasting blessings. Long before commercial Mothers' Day was invented, this day was also taken as an occasion to visit and especially celebrate our mothers.

LENTEN FAST & ABSTINENCE, ALMSGIVING, and PENANCE

- **ABSTINENCE:** Catholics aged 14+ are expected to abstain from meat **on all Fridays of Lent**¹ (and on Ash Wednesday). Eggs, fish, and plant-based substitutes don't count as meat.
- **FASTING:** Catholics aged 18-59 are expected to fast (taking at most one full meal and two small "snacks" that don't add up to a full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and where possible, on Holy Saturday. Drinks such as water or juice don't count as food, but liquids used as food e.g., soups or smoothies do count.
- When you have a medical condition or are pregnant, travelling, or under unusual stress, these requirements may be relaxed.

In addition to fasting and abstinence, giving alms or doing charitable work is expected.

Fridays are days of abstinence all year round, not just during Lent. *Outside* of Lent, however, special acts of charity or piety may be substituted for abstinence on these days.
