REFLECTION

Staring in Judgement

Surrounded by a vicious mob, self-righteous to the core. They knew the law from start to end, convinced that they would score. Their eyes pierced through her very soul, as if they'd raped her heart. And she looked bewildered and forlorn mid a prospect grim and stark.

Mid the scapegoat and the scheming, she stood no chance at all. With the glee of brutal judgement, her fate set to befall. Till a voice of pregnant justice ripped through their empty spake. As she shivered in her shaking feet, she glimpsed another fate.

He kept his eyes down to the ground, while doodling in the sand. In their attempt to get his eyes, deflected by his hand. The one without a single sin can throw all the stones he likes. Those searing words of bitter truth cut through their glaring sight.

LENTEN FAST & ABSTINENCE, ALMSGIVING, and PENANCE

- **ABSTINENCE:** Catholics aged 14+ are expected to abstain from meat **on all Fridays of Lent**¹ (and on Ash Wednesday). Eggs, fish, and plant-based substitutes don't count as meat.
- **FASTING:** Catholics aged 18-59 are expected to fast (taking at most one full meal and two small "snacks" that don't add up to a full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and where possible, on Holy Saturday. Drinks such as water or juice don't count as food, but liquids used as food e.g., soups or smoothies do count.
- When you have a medical condition or are pregnant, travelling, or under unusual stress, these requirements may be relaxed.

In addition to fasting and abstinence, giving alms or doing charitable work is expected.

Fridays are days of abstinence all year round, not just during Lent. *Outside* of Lent, however, special acts of charity or piety may be substituted for abstinence on these days.
