All events scheduled for the church hall and basement are postponed until September, due to flooding with resulting water and sewage damage.



Little Stranger Cakes

"Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on – since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." (Gen 18: 5-6)

When making little cakes for surprise visitors as your obligatory hospitality, it is best not to kneed them too much pat and coat them with some olive oil and if you have it a dusting of crushed rosemary and fresh cracked pepper
