#### **REFLECTION**

#### Peter's Appalled Yes

The dialogue with Peter... begins with his profoundest shock: "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" This is utterly inappropriate, the turning upside-down of every human order of rank, and this to the fullest extent, since not even a free Israelite, let alone the "Lord and Teacher" could be given the task of washing feet, but only a slave....

Peter must utter his *Yes* in persona Ecclesiae [in the person of the Church] in a state of nonunderstanding, in pure obedience, indeed, more than this, in the confusion of an elemental shrinking back in terror....

The freedom to say *No* is something purely abstract for the believer, i.e., for the one who loves; if what he wills is love, the fellowship with Jesus, then he must will what he himself does not want at all: the reversal of the world's order, the Lord's service as a slave. And it is worse than this, because it is after all a question of the dirt on Peter's feet: the one who is utterly pure takes the sin upon himself.

What John [in 13: 1-20] wants us to understand here is that this *Yes*, which is pressed out of Peter, is something appalling for him. Peter is so often required to leap over his own shadow, and here this happens once again in a kind of desperation of love that cannot do anything else: "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!"
