

#### **REFLECTION**

#### A Saint with a Winnipeg Connection: Blessed Vasyl Velychkovsky, 27 June.

Born in 1903 to a priestly family in Stanislaviv, Austria-Hungary (now Ivano-Frankivsk, Ukraine). Vasyl entered the Ukrainian Greek-Catholic major seminary in Lviv at age 17 and was ordained a Redemptorist priest-monk. He became a teacher and preacher of missions, and was Abbot of the Ternopil Monastery. He worked in the breach between Orthodox and Catholic Ukrainians, which was complicated by the conflict between Ukrainians and Poles in the region.



He survived the German occupation of Ukraine, but was arrested in 1945 by the Soviet Government. For refusing an "invitation" to leave the Catholic Church and serve instead as a Russian Orthodox priest, he was handed a death sentence, which was commuted at the very last moment to 10 years of hard labour in arctic coal mines. After his release in 1955, he served the "Underground Church" as a priest in Lviv, and was secretly ordained a bishop in 1963. In 1969 he was again imprisoned for sedition and religious proselytization.

By the time of his release in 1972, he was suffering severe health problems. He was exiled to Winnipeg, where he died in June 1973. Because his death had resulted from years of hard labour under harsh conditions, all due to his stalwart faith and service to the Church persecuted, he is considered a martyr.

On 27 June 2001 he was beatified (along with his older colleague, Blessed Martyr Nykyta Budka) by Pope John Paul II. In 2003, Blessed Vasyl's body was found to be largely uncorrupted (which is taken as a sign of sainthood, especially among the Eastern churches). His intact remains are preserved at St Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church and Shrine, 250 Jefferson Avenue, Winnipeg. Blessed Vasyl was recently proclaimed Patron of the Ukrainian Catholic prison ministry.
