REFLECTION

Fussing about Rewards

....Why should those who have worked only an hour be paid the same as those who have slaved in the hot sun all day? Is the landowner really being unfair?

Perhaps he saw something the first workers didn't see. Perhaps he saw, in his compassion, that their day spent waiting for work, in order to feed their families, was a terrible one, marked by anxiety and a sense of failure. Or perhaps he knew they were poorer, more desperate, or less gifted. Maybe he knew they needed a bit more encouragement.

Here's a second perspective on this mysterious story. We sinners are very susceptible to a reward-centred understanding of our relationship to God. Tit for tat; I do this, then you better do that. But this is very juvenile.

We've been invited to work in the vineyard of the Lord. That is the greatest privilege imaginable, to participate in the Lord's work of saving the world. Why are we fussing about rewards? And how liberating this is! I don't have to spend my life fussing and spying and worrying and comparing.

Sharing God's Gifts Archdiocesan Collection (SGG): Our assessment for 2022 is \$65,582, of which we still owe \$7,254. St Ignatius Statement for the period September 11th to September 17th: To our combined regular Sunday collections in support of our Parish, including school and church expenses, you gave \$3,331.
