#### **REFLECTION**

#### **Our Lives Are Not About Us**

Just before his passion and death, Jesus tells the striking story of the landowner who planted a vineyard. The fertile vineyard stands for Israel, his chosen people. But it could be broadened out to include the world. What do we learn from this beautiful image? That God has made for his people a place where they can find rest, enjoyment, and good work.

We – Israel, the Church, the world – are not the owners of this vineyard; we are tenants. One of the most fundamental spiritual mistakes we can make is to think that we own the world. We are tenants, entrusted with the responsibility of caring for it, but everything that we have and are is on loan. Our lives are not about us.

Christ is God's judgement. In the measure that we reject him or refuse to listen to him, we place our tenancy in jeopardy. And so the great question that arises from this reading: How am I using the gifts that God gave me for God's purposes? My money? My time? My talents? My creativity? My relationships? All is for God, and thus all is under God's judgement.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT

**Sharing God's Gifts Archdiocesan Collection (SGG)**: Our assessment for 2022 is \$65,582, of which we still owe \$6,140. Please make cheques payable to the Parish, earmarked "Sharing God's Gifts" – and print your name and envelope number clearly on the *Sharing God's Gifts* envelope. Thanks for supporting our Archdiocesan ministries.

**St Ignatius Statement for the period September 25**<sup>th</sup> **to October 1**<sup>st</sup>: To our combined regular Sunday collections in support of our Parish, including school and church expenses, you gave \$3,685. For *Sharing God's Gifts* you gave \$826. For the Poor Box you gave \$35. For Haiti you gave \$1,750. Thank you for your generosity!

Contributions made through PAC and PayPal are monitored monthly. For the period July 1<sup>st</sup> to July 31<sup>st</sup>, PAC donations totaled \$15,808. PayPal donations during July totaled \$2,544. For the period of August 1<sup>st</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup>, PAC donations totaled \$15,833. PayPal donations during August totaled \$2,000.
