REFLECTION

You're Invited to a Wedding

Jesus likened the kingdom of heaven to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. Notice that the father (God the Father) is giving a banquet for his son (God the Son) and bride (the Church). Jesus is the marriage of divinity and humanity – and we his followers are invited to join in the joy of this union.

The joyful intimacy of the Father and son is now offered to us to be shared. Listen to Isaiah to learn the details of this banquet: "On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear." (Isa 25:6)

Now there is an edge to all of this. For it is the king who is doing the inviting and it is a wedding banquet for his son. We can see how terribly important it is to respond to the invitation of the King of kings.

We have heard the invitation of God to enter into intimacy with him, to make him the centre of our lives, to be married to him in Christ – and often we find the most pathetic excuses not to respond.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Sharing God's Gifts Archdiocesan Collection (SGG): Our assessment for 2022 is \$65,582, of which we still owe \$5,396. St Ignatius Statement for the period October 2nd to October 8th: To our combined regular Sunday collections in support of our Parish, including school and church expenses, you gave \$5,849. For *Sharing God's Gifts* you gave \$744. For the Poor Box you gave \$69. For Agape you gave \$80. For Haiti you gave \$230. Thank you for your generosity!

Contributions made through PAC and PayPal are monitored monthly. For the period July 1st to July 31st, PAC donations totaled \$15,808. PayPal donations during July totaled \$2,544. For the period of August 1st to 31st, PAC donations totaled \$15,833. PayPal donations during August totaled \$2,000.
