REFLECTION

INTERCESSION BY ST BLAISE

Blaise of Sebaste (Latin: Blasius) was a 4th Century physician, bishop, and martyr in Asia Minor. It is said that from being a healer of bodily ailments, he became an expert on souls. At one point, he retired for a time to a cavern where he remained in prayer. As bishop of Sebastea in historical Lesser Armenia (modern Sivas, Turkey), Blaise instructed people as much by his example as by his words, and his great virtues and sanctity were attested by many miracles. People were said to flock to him for cures of bodily and spiritual ills. He is said also to have healed animals, which came to him on their own for his assistance, and that he was, in turn, helped by animals. In 316 AD, Agricola, Governor of Cappadocia and Lesser Armenia, began a persecution by order of the Roman Emperor Licinius, and Blaise was seized. After his interrogation and a severe scourging, he was imprisoned, tortured with iron combs, and subsequently beheaded.

Blaise became one of the most popular saints of the Middle Ages. His followers were widespread in plague-afflicted Europe in the 11th and 12th Centuries. The legendary *Acts of St. Blaise* were written 400 years after his death, and include elements apocryphal and possibly fictional. According to one such legend, while Blaise was on his way to imprisonment, a distraught mother, whose only child was choking on a fish bone, threw herself at his feet and implored his intercession. Touched by her distress, he offered up his prayers, and the child was cured. This episode did not, however, soften the hearts of his persecutors.

He is venerated as a saint and martyr in the Catholic, Anglican, and Orthodox Churches, and is counted as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. He is currently venerated in countries as far-flung as Iceland, where he is known as Blasíus; Italy (San Biagio); Portugal, Brazil, and Goa (São Brás); England and the Channel Islands; Croatia (Sveti Vlaho or Sveti Blaž); and Spanish-speaking countries (San Blas). Blaise is known as the saint of wild beasts, patron of wool combers, and above all, helper of sufferers from respiratory, eye, nose, and throat ailments. Such ailments are now taken to include obstructive sleep apnea, since it involves throat tissues interfering with breathing during sleep.

In many places, on February 3rd, his feast-day, the blessing of St Blaise is offered: two candles, (sometimes lit), are held in the form of a cross by a priest (or deacon or lay person) over the head of each of the faithful – or are touched to the person's throat. Simultaneously, the following blessing is given: "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness". Then the priest makes the Sign of the Cross over the faithful. As this is a blessing, not a sacrament, non-Catholics may choose to receive it. However, it is considered important that the blessing be given in the context of a Mass or prayer session, so as to be understood clearly as a plea for intercession with God, rather than as magic.
