### A SPIRITUALITY OF MINDFULNESS AND VIGILANCE

Today's first reading is best understood by picturing someone praying these verses in the middle of Jerusalem's destroyed temple. The Babylonian emperor Nebuchadnezzar had wiped Jerusalem and its temple off the face of the earth in 586 B.C.E. and forced a large percentage of Israelites into exile. They remained there until 530 BC, when the Persians conquered Babylon and let the captives return to the Promised Land. Yet most Jews chose to remain in exile! No matter how hard it was to live in a foreign land, in this case it was better than completely rebuilding one's homeland. How do you convince a generation to spend their lives reconstructing a new city and a new temple?

As much as the prophet wants his people to return to the Promised Land, he sees that building a geographic place only makes sense after someone is committed to building or rebuilding a relationship with Yahweh. The destroyed edifices are simply a sign of Israel's destroyed covenant with Yahweh. If people refuse to rebuild the relationship, forget about the buildings. New buildings are in God's plan only if they're the outward sign of a rebuilt relationship. People won't notice God breaking into their lives until they make a commitment to become the people of God.

The body of 1 Corinthians makes it clear that some in that community used their "tongue-gifted" discourse to turn individuals against one another, and their knowledge to run roughshod over those with a "weak conscience." Much work still needed to be done before everyone was ready for the second coming of the risen Jesus. The first step would be to return to Isaiah's insistence that Yahweh's people develop a relationship with Yahweh. Biblical faith isn't just a matter of slavishly obeying specific rules and regulations; it's much more a matter of living up to the responsibilities we've assumed in relationship with the Living God. A relationship dictates our actions, not a set of regulations.... The older we get, the more we notice what we've destroyed throughout our lives and what we need to rebuild. Perhaps such a reflection will help us approach this Advent with a biblical perspective.... [The earliest Christians focused on Easter, rather than Christmas].... Events like Christmas become most significant if we celebrate them against the background of relationships. It's in such relationships that we most experience God's presence.

Today's reading from Mark reminds us that we are also gatekeepers and watchers, household servants who keep the lamps trimmed and the fires burning as a way of life, a spirituality of mindfulness and vigilance. Advent signals us to be ready. Something wonderful is about to happen.


