THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION IN THE TEMPLE IN LITURGICAL AND HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

The Feast of the Presentation is one of the oldest feasts of the Christian church, celebrated since the mid-4th Century in Jerusalem, from where it gradually spread westwards in the 6th Century. Also called Candlemas or the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, it is based on the account in today's Gospel reading of the presentation of Jesus at the temple. In accordance with Jewish Law, a boy was to be circumcised after seven days; then, on the 33rd day after that, the mother was to be purified by presenting a lamb as a burnt offering, and either a young pigeon or a dove as a sin offering (Leviticus 12). Once the date of Christmas was fixed as the night of December 24th/25th by Pope Liberius in 354 AD, the Presentation therefore logically had to fall on the 40th day of Christmas, i.e., February 2nd. Traditionally, this was the conclusion of the Christmas-Epiphany season. The Extraordinary Form (Latin Mass rite) still continues the Christmas season until Candlemas. However, the official Christmas season in the current Roman Rite calendar has been shortened and now ends right after the Baptism of Jesus (i.e., the Sunday that follows Epiphany). This may have been done to preclude occasional coincidence with the earliest days of Lent (i.e., in years when Ash Wednesday comes unusually early).

While it is customary for Christians in some countries to remove their Christmas decorations on Twelfth Night (Epiphany Eve), in other Christian countries they traditionally remove them on Candlemas. Many Christians (especially Anglicans, Methodists, Lutherans, Orthodox, and Roman Catholics) also bring candles to their local church on Candlemas, where they are blessed and used for the rest of the year. These blessed candles then serve as an on-going symbol of Jesus Christ, Light of the World.


